UK public 'supports <u>green recovery</u> from <u>coronavirus crisis</u>'
<u>Climate Assembly UK</u> says <u>economic plan</u> should help reach <u>net zero carbon</u> emissions

People would be prepared to continue many of <u>the lifestyle changes</u> enforced by <u>the coronavirus lockdown</u> to help tackle <u>the climate emergency</u>, and the government would have <u>broad support</u> for a <u>green economic recovery</u> from the crisis, according to a report.

Working from home is a popular option, along with changes to how people travel, and the government should take the opportunity to rethink investment in infrastructure and support <u>low-carbon industries</u>, the report found. Nearly eight in ten of the members said the measures <u>taken</u> by the government to help the economic recovery from <u>Covid-19</u> should be <u>designed to help reach net zero</u>, and an even <u>bigger proportion</u> – 93% — said that, <u>as the lockdown eased</u>, the government and employers should encourage lifestyle changes to cut emissions.

"It was quite clear that many of the assembly members felt this period should be taken as an opportunity to encourage <u>a green economic recovery</u> with a focus on promoting <u>cleaner</u>, <u>greener lifestyles</u>, and an economy that <u>prizes sustainability over short-term benefits</u> that would harm the planet," said Ibrahim, an assembly member who is a GP from Surrey.

- When complete, the Grand Renaissance Dam, which Ethiopia is building, will be Africa's biggest hydroelectric power plant.

تدهور الوضع الاقتصادي في اليمن

يزداد الوضع الأقتصادي في اليمن سوءاً يوماً بعد يوم، وبشكل مقلق، حيث تسببت ممارسات الميليشيات الانقلابية في انحدار النشاط الاقتصادي إلى القاع، وزعزعة النظام المالي والمصرفي واقترابه من الانهيار، في حين شهد اليمن موجة نزوح واسعة للسكان من مناطق القتال. ويعاني حوالي 14.1 مليون يمني من انعدام الأمن الغذائي وتدني الطلب الكلي (الإنفاق الاستهلاكي والاستثماري)، وجمود ما تبقى من حركة في النشاط الاقتصادي، وارتفاع مستويات البطالة والفقر.

ويؤكد أستاذ الاقتصاد بجامعة تعز مجهد قحطان، أن المؤشرات المعروضة تؤكد فظاعة ما آلت إليه أوضاع اليمن نتيجة للحرب التي أشعلها الانقلابيون، مشيراً إلى أن تلك المؤشرات تؤكد بخول اليمن في حالة انهيار اقتصادي، وانهيار النظام المصرفي، وانعدام السيولة النقدية، وعدم القدرة على دفع رواتب موظفي الدولة المدنيين والعسكريين، ونفاد الاحتياطي النقدي من العملات الأجنبية، مع تزايد أعباء الدين الخارجي، ومضاعفة حجم المديونية الداخلية واستمرار تزايد أعبائها، وتوقف الدورة الاقتصادية، مع عدم وجود حركة استثمارية أو أي تعامل مع العالم الخارجي عدا تدفق المساعدات الإغاثية والسلع الغذائية والضرورية.
